Adjudicator

Helen Leek



Helen was a scholar and prize winner at the Royal Academy of Music and was awarded the JBR trophy at the Royal Over-Seas League competition. She subsequently studied with Alexander Satz in Vienna with the help of an Austrian Government Scholarship. Helen was one of the major prize winners at the International Young Concert Artists Competition and was the silver medalist in the Brant International Piano competition.

Helen has performed across Europe both as a soloist and chamber musician, with her innovative multi media programmes drawing much critical acclaim.

She is an examiner and trainer for the ABRSM for which she has also recorded teaching videos.

Her exciting website: masterpianist .org, has a wealth of information that students may find useful. As well as being an experienced presenter, having given numerous lecture recitals and presented seminars for ABRSM throughout SE Asia, she is also an examiner and trainer for the ABRSM.

Her innovative programmes have 'reinvigorated chamber music' (The Times) and her work in this area was recognized by the Royal Philharmonic Society when her touring programme 'Sound Bites' was nominated alongside Glyndebourne Opera for the prestigious Royal Philharmonic Audience Development Award, who described her as 'a compelling ambassador for music.'

Standards for Classes

These standards relate to the grade of music to be played in the class rather than any grade that the performer has achieved. Any competitor entered under the wrong standard risks disqualification.

This will be held in the McGuinness Music School on Saturday 4 May at 7.00pm where invited class winners will once again, have the opportunity to perform their winning piece on the Steinway Grand Piano. Trophies awarded at the end of the evening are at the discretion of the adjudicator.

There will be a collection on behalf of the Salesian College for the Handicapped Childrens' Pilgrimage Trust (HCPT. Entry is free but donations are always welcome!

Rules of the Festival

1 OPEN CLASSES* - Any entrant deriving a regular income from teaching or performing the chosen instrument or dance may enter only classes marked 'Open'
2 Open Classes: 10, 13, 17, 20, 22, 25, 28 and 41, 45, 46 for the ensemble classes.
3 AGE - A competitor's age is determined by the age or that of the oldest member of a group at the official closing date.

4 CHILD PROTECTION - Entry forms for persons under the age of 18 or vulnerable adults must be signed by the adult (parent/ guardian/ carer/ teacher) who will be responsible for their supervision at the festival. Forwarding of the Entry Form shall constitute acceptance of that responsibility.

5 ENTRY FEES - Fees are not refundable and entrants may not perform until paid. Cheques to be made payable to "Aldershot and Farnborough Festival". Bank transfer details as detailed on entry form. **LATE ENTRIES** - Will only be accepted at the discretion of the organiser. Competitors will be notified of the date and time of their class not later than one week before the event.

6 ENTRY FORMS - must give the name of their own choice piece(s) to be performed together with the name of the composer and the time limit.

7 COPIED MUSIC - Photocopies must be left with the organiser to be destroyed. These may only be used to provide a copy for the Adjudicator and not as the main source of the music. When using printed copies downloaded from the Internet or stored electronically the performer must also print off and submit the permission statement, which accompanies the music.

8 TROPHIES - Must be returned unaltered and in good condition, by the specified date for each section.

Engraving is at the competitor's expense and must be in keeping with the existing engraving.

9 COMMUNICATION WITH ADJUDICATORS by competitors, teachers or other interested parties, apart from the committee, prior to or during the competition is not permitted.

10 TIME LIMITS - must not be exceeded. Adjudicators may stop a performance at any time.

11 RECORDING - Photography or video or audio recording will not be permitted at any performance or concert. Any type of recording is in serious breach of the Child Protection Policy.

12 LOST PROPERTY - The festival and its officers will not accept responsibility for any property, personal or otherwise, which may be lost or damaged at any venue of the festival.
13 COMMUNICATIONS - Requests for a written reply must be accompanied by a stamped addressed envelope.

14 CERTIFICATES - No competitor may receive more than one certificate for one class.

Piano section rules in addition to the general rules of the festival.

1. Competitors may enter only **ONE** of classes 29 to 35 inclusive.

2. In all classes a copy of the music must be provided for the Adjudicator

3. No piece may be played in more than one class by the same competitor.

4. <u>Repeats: all da capo and dal segno indications should be</u> <u>observed but all other repeats should be omitted, unless they are</u> <u>very brief (i.e. a few bars).</u>

5. Designated professionals may only enter OPEN classes.

6. The organiser reserves the right to restrict the size of any class.

7. Entrants entered under the wrong standard risk disqualification.

8. Duets and Trios count as one entry.

9. All competitors must be able to attend at their stated times as no concessions can be allowed.

10. It is the responsibility of Teachers to ensure that their pupils' are conversant with Festival rules.

11. There will be a door entry fee of £5.00 per adult on each of the Festival days. Free programme included.

12. Teachers, competitors and under 16's go FREE

DATA PROTECTION ACT

Data is held solely for the purpose of running the festival and will not be disclosed to third parties except to enable it to fulfil its constitutional purpose.

PERFORMING RIGHTS

The Festival is affiliated to the British and International Federation of Festivals for Music, Dance and Speech of which Her Majesty the Queen is Patron. As an annual fee is paid to the Performing Rights Society a separate licence for live or recorded music to be played at the Festival is not required.

CHILD PROTECTION POLICY

The Festival's child protection policy is on the Festival Websites, available from Section Organisers and displayed at venues. Neither the Festival nor the owners of the Festival venues undertake any supervision whatsoever of persons under 18 (children) or vulnerable adults. Responsibility for their adequate supervision and that of any such persons accompanying those lies at all times with the person entering them in the Festival. If that person is not the primary carer* then they must make suitable arrangements to satisfy the primary carer* that there will be adequate supervision.

*Primary carer- the parents, guardian or carer who has primary care of the child or vulnerable adult.

CHILD PROTECTION RULE

Anyone entering a person under the age of 18 or a vulnerable adult is responsible for their supervision at the Festival. Forwarding of the entry form shall constitute acceptance of that responsibility.
